Glasswool R3.5 Batts shortage

The Federal Government Energy Efficient Homes programme is now in full swing and is having both expected & unexpected effects on our industry.



One of the expected effects is the massive demand for R3.5 insulation batts for installation under the Government scheme. This has resulted in both of the Australian based manufacturers, as well as numerous other companies, importing vast quantities of batts from countries such as USA, China, UK & Malaysia.

An unexpected effect has been the shortage of higher grade insulation for use in the airconditioning and industrial insulation industries.

FM Insulation are working hard to counter both of these effects. As well as securing the supply of domestic insulation from Malaysia & China we are also sourcing 48kg/M3 fibreglass from the same factories.

New Products

Over the past 12 months FM Insulation has introduced a number of new materials into our product range.

[Foil Faced Chemically Cross Linked Polyethylene](#)

A product suitable for the insulation of both hot & chilled water this product is gaining ready market acceptance as a replacement for polystyrene on chilled water systems and for fibreglass on hot water systems



[Perlite pipe & block insulation](#)

Corrosion under insulation (CUI) has haunted plant owners & engineers for years. Insulation contractors have tried, mainly unsuccessfully, to install totally weatherproof cladding systems to prevent the ingress of moisture, which together with the chlorides in insulation materials is the

cause of CUI.

Perlite with a high content of soluble silicate of soda appears to be the answer to CUI and has been used on a number of major projects as a replacement for rockwool & calcium silicate insulation previously installed.
